

Voluntary Agreements

Child and Parent Place (CAPP) must receive a typed, signed and endorsed court order or mutually voluntary agreement which outlines the required details of participation at Child and Parent Place.

Voluntary agreements are required for families who do not have a court order or whose court order does not identify all of the necessary details.

You can use the information below as a guideline to assist you in writing your agreement.

Agreement must include:
Agreement to participate: Parties are agreeing to participate in Child and Parent Place services
Type of access: Supervised <u>visits</u> or <u>exchanges</u> (the word <u>visit</u> or <u>exchange</u> must appear)
Frequency: How frequently will the visits occur? (weekly, biweekly, monthly)
Duration: How long will the visits be? (maximum of 2 hours)
Fees: Who is responsible for the fees? (if this is not identified, then fees will be split between parties)
Residency of child: information regarding the current custody arrangement and/or primary residency of the child, even if the arrangement is for the interim
Review date: a date which parties will review the continued need for supervised access (maximum of 1 year from the date of this letter)
Signatures: Signatures of both parties as well as witness signatures
